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THE GUIDE

Sometimes Poirot's previous cases are referenced in other books. For those looking to avoid spoilers we'd make the following suggestions:

- ◆ If you're going to read all the stories, you can read *Curtain* last
- ◆ If you're going to read 10 Poirot stories in your life, make sure *Curtain* is one of them
- ◆ *Elephants Can Remember* references plots from *Five Little Pigs*, *Hallowe'en Party*, and *Mrs McGinty's Dead*, so if you are keen to spot these, read the other three first.
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- ◆ Watch out for a spoiler from *Three Act Tragedy* if you're reading *Hercule Poirot's Christmas* first
